After considering the offers which had been received, it was agreed that the offer by Messrs. F.W. Simpson & Co. for the supply of these chairs at 35/10d each be accepted.

SEDERUNT. - Dean of Guild Thompson left the meeting at this stage.

44. BEACH HALL CAFETERIA. It was resolved that the offer by Craighouse Cabinet Co. Ltd. to supply 60 tables with formica tops be accepted at the price of £6:15/- each, the Town Clerk being advised to suggest to the manufacturers that the tables be dowelled and that he ascertain what additional cost would be involved in having this work done.

Collective is delighted to present *A leisure* complex a new performance event by artist Dennis McNulty, commissioned as part of *All Sided Games*.

A leisure complex explores the histories of Carnoustie Leisure Centre with a promenade performance through the building, including the original 1930s Beach Hall, the additions made in the 1950s and 1980s, and the recently constructed cafe.

Dennis carries out detailed research of various kinds, and informed by his studies in psychoacoustics, his final artworks often draw on aspects of cinema, sculpture, sound and performance. He spent time in the summer living and working in Carnoustie to develop this project.

Around the turn of the last century, when Carnoustie was being marketed as 'The Brighton of the North', the town hosted performances by various groups during the Summer on ad hoc stages on the beach. Some of these performers called for a permanent venue to be established on the seafront and in 1934 their wishes came true with the construction of the Beach Hall.

Over the years, various additions have been made to this structure, beginning with a cafeteria in 1959, around which time the hall was re-branded as a Conference Hall. The Main Hall was added in 1987 and the most recent addition, Madison's Cafe, was opened in June 2014, in time to serve visitors to the Commonwealth Games shooting events at nearby Barry Buddon Training Centre.

All Sided Games is a series of off-site commissions, placing artists in and around venues built or used for the Edinburgh 1970 and 1986 Commonwealth Games and in venues to be used for the Glasgow 2014 Games. It brings people together to make work of mutual interest.

Collective is a contemporary visual arts organisation that delivers an exciting and ambitious programme of new exhibitions, commissions and projects. Established in 1984 to support new and emergent artists to exhibit work in Edinburgh, it now commissions new work by artists who are at a pivotal stage in their development.
