Since 1984, Collective has been fundamental to the cultural vitality of Scotland. Through bringing people together around the production and presentation of new work, Collective has developed a significant international reputation. In 2013, Collective moved to the City Observatory on Calton Hill and we have been working to re-develop this historic site. In 2018, the restored City Observatory and Dome, along with a new exhibition space and purpose-built restaurant, will open together as Collective.

The role

This role offers an opportunity to be part of a small team dedicated to the everyday running of our new retail space which will be situated in the fully restored City Observatory. Our shop will showcase the work of contemporary artists, makers and brands through a selection of limited editions and

pecially commissioned products. Inspired by our home on Calton Hill, our carefully selected ranges will complement the buildings, people and natural beauty that surrounds us. We collaborate to produce bespoke products, aiming to source from environmentally and socially responsible companies and working within Scotland and the rest of the UK, where possible. All purchases made will directly support Collective and our work with artists and audiences.

What benefits do we offer?

We offer a pension scheme, contributing up to 2% of your salary into a defined contribution scheme. You will be provided with an annual comprehensive schedule of training. You will be entitled to 25 days' holiday and 8 bank holidays (pro rata) each year. Staff are encouraged to attend intensive programmes, artists talks, reading groups, cultural talks and events. We also offer discounts in our shop.

MAIN DUTIES

- The retail assistant will be part of a small team responsible for the day-to-day running of the shop.
- Responsible for the opening, closing and cashing up of the shop.
- Greet customers and provide excellent customer care standard at all times.
- Work towards achieving sales targets.
- Have strong knowledge of our product ranges.
- Consistent replenishment and maintenance of the shops visual merchandising standards.
- Sort deliveries, assist stock control and stocktaking.
- Support the Retail Manager in the further development of our retail offer and brand liaising with partners, artists and manufacturers.
- Assist with the development and delivery of bespoke marketing and retail events.

MAIN TASKS

- Work closely with the Collective team to ensure smooth day-to-day running of the site.
- Advise customers and respond to queries.
- Handle payments and operate the checkout.
- Daily banking and postage
- Performing regular stock checks.
- Assist with deliveries ensuring that stock is safely and neatly stored in the stockroom and that relevant paperwork is completed accurately and without delay.
- Inputting new stock to EPOS systems including pricing and barcoding.
- Upholding the highest standards of handling, display and storage of artist editions and products.
- Ensuring products are fully stocked, clearly priced and attractively displayed.

- Day-to-day monitoring and fulfilment of ecommerce sales including packaging and arranging delivery.
- Dealing promptly and efficiently with email, phone and postal enquires.
- Assist with the administration of the shop including maintaining accurate paperwork, researching and costing suppliers.
- Reporting discrepancies and problems to the line manager.
- General housekeeping duties.
- Security awareness and self-awareness on the shop floor, being aware of potential shop lifters and fraudulent credit card use. Invigilation and monitoring of the astronomical instruments.
- Responding to general visitor enquiries.
- Occasional support to events and catering staff and welcoming guests.
